

Advertising in the Packet

The Packet is funded by advertising revenue and a generous grant from Poundstock Parish Council. We pay for printing and our website rental, but apart from that everything is done for nothing by volunteers. We are and always have been a non-profit organisation and aim to keep our costs to the absolute minimum. This means we can keep our advertising charges to an absolute minimum, too.

All year our distributors faithfully take the magazine to every home in the parish – that's the whole parish, from Cancleave to Helscott, Penfound to Trewint, Widemouth to Treskinnick and Bangors and everywhere in between and beyond. They do this six times a year – and we know that the copies they deliver are often passed on to friends and family living outside the parish, so a lot of local people see our advertisements on a regular basis. Many people keep a copy of the Packet handy so they have firms' phone numbers and email addresses available whenever they're needed. That's pretty good coverage for an advertisement with an annual cost of only £30 (for an eighth of a page) or £40 (for a quarter).

Normally we have a waiting list of people wanting to advertise with us, but not this year. Pumpkins, pumpkins, pumpkins ...



Our Night Sky in October 2020

Jupiter and Saturn, which have been delighting us through the summer months, will set about 2300, but Mars will be high in the south east and will be visible throughout the night, being at its brightest since 2018. It will set in the south west at daybreak, but Venus will be shining brilliantly, rising in the east at 0400 and travelling westwards until the sun removes it from sight. Meanwhile, the winter constellations of Taurus and Orion will be making an appearance in the east about 2200, and will be visible throughout the night.

More than seven billion years ago, two immense black holes circled each other until they collided and merged, a cataclysm so intense that it sent ripples soaring through the fabric of space-time. In the early morning hours of 21 May 2019, the signal picked up by two observatories – LIGO in the United States and Virgo in Italy – came in the form of gravitational waves: disruptions in space-time that massive cosmic events can set into motion

Researchers estimate that two black holes 66 and 85 times more massive than our sun spiralled into each other, uniting to form a black hole 142 times more massive than our sun.

The event, announced a few days ago, is by far the biggest ever detected via gravitational waves. In a fraction of a second, the merging black holes released roughly eight times more energy than that contained within our sun's atoms,

The black hole merger is causing a lot of scientific excitement, for a few reasons. First, the black hole it produced fills in a perplexing gap in our observations. Until now, researchers had found black holes tens of times more massive than our sun and supermassive black holes millions to billions times more massive than our sun, but never had confirmed one between 100 and 100,000 solar masses. At about 142 solar masses, GW190521's final black hole is the first ever found in this intermediate range.

I will write more about black holes in the next magazine.

Shakespeare - The Merry Wives of Windsor

'Oh joy and rapture unforeseen'. I can't tell you how delighted I am. Yesterday I was down in the dumps what with the plague about to spike again as anti-social-distancing hordes flocked to the seaside or rioted on the London streets in order to up the 'r' factor. (*I wrote this a month or so ago.*) But today that is all in the distant past as I sit at the breakfast table and look at my unopened parcel. I know what it is (after all I ordered it), but the pleasure is really yet to come. I will open it carefully to reveal the colourful front cover with a perfect picture of a bullfinch and a goldfinch.

And there it is! A Field Guide to the Birds of Britain and Europe. The best bird book in the world.

And this copy is extra special because it is the 1954 edition. I lent my copy to someone 45 years ago and never got it back. It has a checklist of birds seen. I can remember them all, and I'll tick them off again after breakfast.

The book is accurate to the *n*th degree; its pictures are colour perfect, and its text leaves no room for doubt: **BLACKBIRD:** 'Male, a sturdy *all-black* bird, with *bright orange-yellow bill and eye-rim.*' Even the description of the voice of the **KESTREL**: 'A shrill repeated "kee, kee, kee" and a more musical double note "kee-lee".'

The maps show clearly where in Europe you can see them in summer or winter.

But the crowning glory of the book (especially for me, a linguist) is the name in five languages: **ENGLISH**: _____ (see the answer below), **DUTCH** IJsvogel, **GERMAN** Eisvogel, **FRENCH** Martin-pêcheur, **SWEDISH** Kungsfiskare. Can you work out what the bird is in English?

Paper is so much more satisfying than an app to identify birds!

Parish Council Chairman's Report

The parking restrictions at Widemouth and the 50 mph limit on the A39 are now in operation, and Enforcement Officers have been working along Marine Drive. A considerable amount of concern has been voiced over some aspects of the schemes and it would be helpful if any comments could be made in writing to the Clerk [contact details are on page 21]. The Widemouth scheme will be reviewed in the autumn and there will be a further opportunity for residents to have a say. The consultation will be advertised, so please pass the message round, and be prepared to take part.



The Parish Council continues to operate through virtual meetings on Zoom for both regular Council meetings and separate planning sessions, and residents are able to join in the meeting by contacting the Clerk beforehand.

The Parish Council is in the process of upgrading the website to bring it into line with legislation to make it usable and understandable to the majority of people with or without hearing, visual or mobility disabilities. If you use website accessibility aids yourself, or know of somebody else who does, it would be helpful to have positive feedback as the work proceeds. Please let the Clerk have details so that we can keep you informed.

Cornwall Council has redeployed a number of its staff to other duties during lockdown, so a number of routine functions have been put on hold. The Planning Department has had a large increase in work, contrary to expectation, and has changed some its procedures as a result. Details of all changes and advice can be found on the Cornwall Council Covid-19 web page (www.cornwall.gov.uk/).

The government has just announced the next round of Covid-19 restrictions/guidelines and I am sure that we shall all do our best to remain safe for ourselves and those around us. We are all finding many aspects of life more complicated and difficult than before, and are looking forward to coming through this all to be able to enjoy a more normal existence.

Legal Update

Emergency Workers: Emergency workers are very often unsung heroes. They go about their job diligently, protect us and often save lives. It is therefore staggering how often police, prison officers, custody officers, fire fighters and frontline health workers suffer abuse and physical assault. Currently the maximum penalty for assaulting emergency workers is one year. Sentencing reforms have now been announced to increase the maximum penalty to two years. The Ministry of Justice says the new law will offer greater protection to these frontline emergency workers – but I personally have my doubts that it will do much to stop such attacks, but time will tell.

Reporting Neighbours: The Policing Minister has been extensively quoted for encouraging people to report neighbours flouting the new 'rule of six' coronavirus restriction. They can do this by using the non-emergency number 101. People now face fines of up to £3,200 if they do not abide by the measures in both indoor and outdoor settings. Apparently Snow White has given notice to two of her small friends to take a hike!

Boost to Care Staff: Ten home care workers employed by the contractors Diligent Care Services and Premier Carewaiting, both commissioned by Harringey Council in London, have won their claim in the employment tribunal. Judgment has just been given saying that travelling and waiting time of up to 60 minutes between appointments should be treated as work time, and therefore they should be paid for it. Unison said the decision has implications for thousands of care workers across the UK who care for vulnerable people in their own homes. The successful carers will receive an average settlement of around £10,000 each following the favourable court ruling.

Drivers Who Kill Others: Drivers who kill others after speeding, racing or using a phone could now receive life sentences under new legislation. Those causing death by careless driving under the influence of drink or drugs could also get a life sentence. Sentencing reforms will be put before Parliament early next year. They include a proposal for a new offence of causing serious injury by careless driving. At present, without that specific offence, drivers who cause injuries under such circumstances can only be convicted of careless driving. This presently has a maximum penalty of a fine.

Virus Scams: An analysis by UK Finance shows that bank scams have increased by an alarming 84 per cent during the lockdown. Cases of impersonation fraud have nearly doubled in the first six months of the year. The banking trade body said there had been 15,000 reports of such scams, with these resulting in losses of £58 million – a 3 per cent year-on-year increase. Of the 15,000 reported impersonation scams, over 8,200 cases involved criminals impersonating the police or a bank, while 6,700 cases involved fraudsters pretending to be from organisations like utilities companies, telecoms providers or government departments. I am sure the vast majority of us have been victims of such attempted scams – maximum alert is required at all times.

Pension Appeal Setback: Two women affected by the state pension age being changed from 60 to 66 for women lost their appeal against a High Court ruling. Campaigners claimed that women born in the 1950s have been treated unfairly by rapid changes in their pension age. On 15 September, Appeal Judges unanimously dismissed the women's appeal. They said that introducing the same state pension age for men and women did not amount to unlawful discrimination. Joanne Welch, founder and director of campaign group Backto60, said she would now consider taking the case to the Supreme Court and would also draft legislation to bring a women's bill of rights.

Flammable Cladding: The Commons Public Accounts Committee has warned that thousands of flat dwellers have been 'condemned to lives of stress and fear' over the government's failure to replace flammable cladding on high-rise buildings. Following the Grenfell disaster in 2017, the government pledged to provide safe alternatives to dangerous cladding on all multi-storey buildings, but just 155 out of 455 high-rises with similar flammable cladding to Grenfell have had it replaced to date. The committee said that progress has 'been unacceptably slow' and leaseholders have been the victims of a 'system-wide failure'.

PA20/05248 Downs Barton, Vicarage Lane, Poundstock EX23 0AX, proposed Listed Building consent for repair of existing storm-damaged barn, Mr and Mrs R. Pearce, no comments given.

Ward Member Report: Cornwall Councillor Nicky Chopak gave an update on the Widemouth Bay Parking Scheme; she asked for observations on parking around the Beach House Shop. Work has begun on the A39 Bangors Speed Reduction Scheme with dragon teeth road marking giving the effect of road narrowing now in place and 50 mph signage expected soon. A similar scheme at Hele Bridge has been put forward to slow traffic along the A39. Vehicle speed monitoring is to be carried out at Kennacott along the A39. Public Space Protection Order – No Dogs on Beaches has been reinforced for the summer; permission was requested for the training of volunteers by Cornwall Council to enforce control, all agreed. It has been confirmed that Stratton Minor Injuries Unit will remain open overnight until April 2021; Cllr Chopak and colleagues are working to ensure this will be a permanent arrangement.
