




Grandfather Thomas Medland's Cornish Song

Does this round strike a chord? It was sung in this area in the mid 1800s by, among others, Thomas Medland, who emigrated to New Zealand in 1865 (that's him pictured above, in later life). Thomas was born in Poundstock and subsequently lived in St Gennys, where he learned the song at Bible Class. He used to sing it in his new home and taught it to his son Joseph, and it has been passed on through the family ever since. It was kindly sent to us by his great granddaughter Lynda Medland, probably our farthest-flung reader,.







Our Night Sky in October 2021

Venus will be setting in the southwest shortly after sunset, while Saturn and Jupiter will follow suit about midnight, so make the most of these delightful planets. To compensate, the first of the winter constellations will be making an appearance in the east, with Orion showing himself just as the two gas planets leave us in the west.

Ingenuity, the Martian helicopter, has been carrying out ever more demanding flights, and its ninth was, according to the scientists operating it, 'a nail biting affair'! Flight 9 was not like the flights that came before it. It broke records for flight duration and cruise speed, and it nearly quadrupled the distance flown between two airfields. But what really set the flight apart was the terrain that Ingenuity had to negotiate during its 2 minutes and 46 seconds in the air - an area called 'Séítah' that would be difficult to traverse with a ground vehicle like the Perseverance rover. This flight was also explicitly designed to have science value by providing the first close view of major science targets that the rover will not reach for some time.

On a later flight, Ingenuity will send back colour images that Perseverance's scientists are looking forward to studying. Captured in those images are rock outcrops that show contacts between the major geologic units on Jezero Crater's floor. They also include a system of fractures the Perseverance team calls 'Raised Ridges', which the rover's scientists hope to visit in part to investigate whether an ancient subsurface habitat might be preserved there. Finally, they are hoping the colour images will provide the closest look yet at 'Pilot Pinnacle', a location featuring outcrops that some team members think may record some of the deepest water environments in old Lake Jezero.

When you consider that this helicopter is operating millions of miles away from Earth, in an atmosphere only just capable of supporting it, and having each flight pre-planned so that it can operate autonomously, the achievements the scientists have made are astonishing.



The dangerous Funnel Web Spider (photo Hamish Weir, Unsplash) 'MUM, DAD, COME QUICKLY, I'M GOING TO DIE!' 'Why?'

'BECAUSE I'VE JUST SEEN A FUNNEL WEB SPIDER IN THAT GORSE BUSH, AND IT'S GOING TO KILL ME!!!'

Let's get two things straight: Funnel Web Spiders are dangerous, lethal to humans, and a painful death follows 15 minutes of agony. Do not approach them and stay at least three feet away. They are shiny dark brown to black.

The other thing is that Funnel Webs **ONLY** live about 12,000 miles away in Australia. You never see them wild in this country.

Funnel Web Spiders are, we hope, about to contribute to medicine. Their venom is horribly dangerous but a protein in it might help to reduce damage from heart attacks. Australian scientists hope to start trials involving human heart transplants in 2023.

Anyway, let's get back to that gorse bush. The spider is a Labyrinth Spider which is a charming little critter, utterly harmless to us, but it's no friend of little insects which it has for breakfast, lunch and supper. The funnel is a kind of lobster pot trap, and the Labyrinth Spider runs up the funnel to catch its home delivery.

The web is made of gossamer-thin thread and is criss-crossed time and again; it is so thickly woven that it seems to be white. It is firmly attached to the gorse prickles, so it stands up to the strongest winds and the wettest rains.

The funnel is also its escape route from nosy children. It is a passage down which the spider runs to get away. Right at the end is a maze of tunnels, and at the end is a nursery room where the eggs hatch into tiny little replicas of Mum. Mum stays with all her children until they are grown up and ready to leave home. Sometimes the

mother dies before the young leave. Then the spiderlings gobble up the mother. 'MUM, I'M COMING QUICKLY, YOU'RE GOING TO DIE!'



Thomas Medland: Cornwall to NZ

My first known Medland family in the area were Richard Medland, b. about 1675, and Philipa French, b. about 1680. They were married in St Juliot Church in 1702 and moved to St Gennys not long after. The family and future generations lived in St Gennys and Poundstock.

Thomas Medland, one of their sons, married Jane Luxon in St Gennys in 1747. Their son John, b. 1752, was my 3 x great grandfather. He married Ann Shephard and was the first of several generations to farm at Woolstone in Poundstock. Their graves are in Poundstock churchyard.

My 2 x great grandfather, their son William, was a bit of a lad – he was probably involved in smuggling and definitely liked a drink and bit of gambling! His first son, William, was born out of wedlock to Mary Broad; they never married. He then had two more children, this time with Mary Fuge, and eventually married her in 1835 at Poundstock Church. Her Fuge family had originally come from St Clether and Altarnun.

William and Mary's family increased. They lived at Woolstone where my great grandfather Thomas James Medland was born in 1841. They moved early in his life to St Gennys, eventually settling at New House (White Lodge) where William died in 1858. Thomas would have had his lessons at St Gennys, and was apprenticed to a carpenter at Camelford. In 1865, at the end of his five-year term, he and his younger brother James left to start a new life on the other side of the world in New Zealand.

The brothers received land grants on Great Barrier Island, about 100 km from Auckland City on North Island, New Zealand. Thomas married in 1878 and with his wife Elizabeth raised a family and built up a large land holding fronting a beautiful bay, now called Medland's Beach. Along with many members of my extended Medland family we now either reside there or have holiday houses in the area.

James returned to England in 1874 and married Rebecca Moyse from Poundstock, after which they sailed to Canada to be with older brother John and sister Ann in Ontario, a popular area for Cornish migrants. We think he also took his mother and another brother, William. James and Rebecca returned to New Zealand from Canada in about 1880.

There were no direct ancestors of mine left in Cornwall after 1874 other than from William Medland, the first illegitimate son, who settled in Stoke Climsland and married a Matilda Parsons.

A Legal View: Beach Huts

When my children were younger, we used to spend a lot of time on the beach. So for many years we were able to rent a beach hut on Crooklets beach in Bude. There was nothing fancy about these huts, but they were large enough and convenient enough for us to keep our beach paraphernalia and we were able to keep our young children happy and amused for many hours on the beach. The cost back then to rent for the summer season was modest, and the waiting list was small.

The beach attracts us all. I understand for some people it means 'Best Escape Anyone Can Have'. I also saw recently the definition of 'beachology'.

Be shore of yourself, don't be crabby.

Let the worries drift away.

Drown out pier pressure.

Soak up positive energy.

Seas life's moments.

How therefore can we resist the beach and pull of the sea? Especially living in Cornwall.

A few years ago we had a family get together in Southwold, a lovely seaside town in Suffolk. Through our contact there, we were also able to hire a beach hut. The cost was £200 per week, and that included beach chairs and a gas hob. With everyone wanting to relax and have downtime, we certainly made full use of it. Whilst walking round the town, I was able to see in the windows of local estate agents many beach huts which had been put on the market for sale, just like any house would be. I have never seen that before, and I found it rather strange at the time. I had to rub my eyes to be sure I read the particulars correctly for most of the beach huts. They were on sale with a starting price of £50,000, with the best ones on sale in region of £70,000.

Time moves on and prices go up. A number of newspapers have recently reported on the sale of a beach hut in Dorset. It is situated at Mudeford, and is for sale for a record £575,000. Agenda items: (a) (i) To consider setting up a Planning Committee for a trial period of 6 months: after lengthy discussions the motion was defeated (5-2). (b) Defibrillator at Treskinnick Cross: Cllr Alison gave an update report regarding current ownership of the telephone box, to be considered at the next meeting. (c) Appointment of a named sexton for Poundstock Cemetery: resolved to appoint Raymond and Ingrid Stacey without any financial implications to the Council. (d) Livestreaming Council meetings: resolved to set up livestreaming via the Parish Council Facebook page.

Reports: (a) Ward Member Report: Launceston MIU will remain closed until 1 October 2021. A public meeting via video conferencing will be held in September to discuss Stratton MIU. There will be extra funding in Cornwall to increase COVID awareness. Enforcement has been under pressure mainly due to COVID, Cllr Chopack asked people to contact her with any concerns. The speed limit of 50 mph on the A39 will be extended to Thorn Cross.

Steering/Working Group Reports: (a) NDPSG Local Landscape Character Assessment (LLCA): Workshops have commenced. The 2019 surveys continue to be uploaded onto Survey Monkey. Steering Group members are attending the Community Hall Working Group. One Steering Group member will be nominated to assist the Clerk with the NDP page on the Parish Council website at the next NDP meeting on 22 September 2021. (b) Community Hall Working Group: A meeting was held with the landowners adjacent to the Parish Hall to discuss the possibility of acquiring land to extend the parking area; resolved to have no further discussion with the landowners. Resolved to obtain information on asbestos removal, and to seek advice from Cornwall Council in relation to the demolition of the Parish Hall and advice on the possibility of rebuilding.


